Baptist Tabernacle Church Building Re-opening Guidelines 2020

A Safer Way of Gathering (Revised December 2020)

- Facebook LIVE Sermons will continue at 9:30 a.m. each Sunday morning from Strickland's Funeral Home for those members who are not ready to enter the Sanctuary for Worship Services – (Thank you Sean Bannon, Glen Brock, and DJ & Kayla Scott!). The Leadership Team is working on the capability to do Facebook LIVE from the Sanctuary.
- Sunday School Classes are currently suspended due to the inability to socially distance within the majority
 of our classes. In addition, Sunday School teachers are being contacted to determine their level of comfort
 in returning to teach.
- 3) 11:00 a.m. Worship Service in Sanctuary (repeat of Facebook LIVE sermon)
 - a) START DATE September 27, 2020 at 11:00 a.m.
 - i) Components of the Worship Service will be phased in over several months
 - b) Please come prepared to show your love and care for others by:
 - i) waiting 6 ft apart (entering, while seated, and exiting)
 - ii) wearing a mask
 - iii) washing hands or using hand sanitizer
 - c) Enter through Sanctuary doors ONLY
 - d) Roping will provide seating 6' apart, families will be seated together
 - e) Service: Welcome, Announcements, Special Music, Prayer Concerns, Prayer, Sermon, Closing
 - i) Service should be 20-30 minutes in length, but have been 40-50 minutes
 - ii) Instrumental music and solos can be phased in as of Oct. 18, 2020
 - iii) Congregational singing has been removed to reduce the potential of virus spread via air borne particles
 - iv) Childcare and Children's Church are not available
 - v) Offering plates will not be passed. Offering collection boxes are provided in Vestibule and FMC Breezeway to use as you exit
 - f) At end of service
 - i) Seating on FMC Side; exit through stained glass doors and out the FMC Breezeway doors
 - ii) Seating on Piano Side: exit from BACK row using center aisle, through front doors
 - g) FMC Restrooms will be available
- 4) 11:00 a.m. Worship Service on FM 87.7 or 87.9 depending on the best reception each Sunday in your car
 only on church property
 - a) Tune your radio dial to FM station you may need to turn the knob on the right side of your presets to find this station, it is NOT typically found by using the "seek" or "search" button– you may also need to turn the volume up higher than you might expect
 - b) This service is the actual service as it is happening in the Sanctuary
- 5) The Sanctuary and FMC are open and available for reservations
 - a) Contact the church office to schedule 919-365-5558
 - b) All meeting participants are expected to follow the 3-Ws:
 - i) Wait 6' apart
 - ii) Wear a mask
 - iii) Wash hands or use hand sanitizer
 - c) NC guidelines of 25 inside and CDC guidelines should be observed.
 - d) Leaders of activities/meetings are expected to use OXIVIR (provided) to sanitize surfaces touched by their group
 - i) OXIVIR is stored in FMC piano storage room above light switch
 - ii) Spray on any surfaces that have been touched by group members prior to departure so the room is ready for the next group NOT FOR FOOD-PREP AREAS
 - iii) No wiping is needed just allow the sprayed surfaces to dry for 5 minutes

Instructions for using Baptist Tabernacle Church facilities during the COVID-19 crisis

When using our church facilities, please remember everyone in your party should:

- wear appropriate face coverings,
- practice social distancing (minimum of 6 ft where practical and safe to do so),
- wash hands often or use hand sanitizer,
- follow the Governor's Executive Order #169 (capacity: 25 indoors, 50 outdoors)
- follow the CDC recommendations and guidelines.

Remember, this virus is spread most effectively by air particles passed from one person to another. Consider this when planning any *SINGING* at your event. It is important that everyone stays safe and healthy so that the church can continue to operate and move forward. Ignoring these precautionary measures may result in closing down the church buildings for an extended period of time.

SELF-SCREENING QUESTIONS:

- Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19?
- Have you been tested for COVID-19 and have not received the results?
- Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat?
- Have you had a fever in the last 48 hours?
- Have you had new loss of taste or smell?
- Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?

If you answered "YES" to any of the screening questions, then you must leave the church *immediately* and seek medical care and/or COVID-19 testing, per CDC guidelines.

TEMPERATURE CHECKS:

You and your party are encouraged to take your/their own temperature prior to arriving at the church. If your/their temperature measures over 100 degrees, please do not come to the church.

LIMIT GROUP GATHERINGS:

During your event, please limit small group gatherings. Keep people moving as much as possible.

BEFORE LEAVING:

After your guests have left the building and the cleaning has been completed according to the reservation paperwork, please heavily spray OXIVIR on tables, chairs, light switches, and any surfaces touched by anyone in your group...but NOT FOR FOOD PREP AREAS. Allow the spray to dry for 5 minutes. OXIVIR spray bottles are located in the FMC piano room above the bookcase beside the light switch.



From the Pastor's Desk:

This is one of my favorite scriptures... Luke 24:1-12 "Now on the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they, and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? "He is not here, but is RISEN! Remember how He spoke to you when He was still in Galilee, "saying, 'The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.' "And they remembered His words. Then they returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them, who told these things to the apostles. And their words seemed to them like idle tales, and they did not believe them. But Peter arose and ran to the tomb; and stooping down, he saw the linen cloths lying by themselves; and he departed, marveling to himself at what had happened." (Luke 24:1-12)

This world offers so many promises! Promises of sin and pleasure and sex and drugs and money and fame and every conceivable combination, yet, every worldly promise is absolutely empty and, in reality offers nothing! So many of us have been taken in by "empty promises," that we are leery of anything or anyone that tells us we can have something for nothing. THE WORLD SIMPLY DOESN'T WORK THAT WAY! But, you know what – God does – God never made a promise that was too good to be true. The truth of the matter is, the world is full of empty promises. We watch TV, and the advertisements tell us that we can be happy, sexy, rich, thin, or famous, if we only purchase a certain product. It doesn't take long before we have been fooled enough to know that the world's promises are full of emptiness. But, God is different. Instead of promises full of emptiness, on Easter, he gave us emptiness that is full of promise. This morning, I would like us to think about the promises of Easter. There are 3 of them. Each promise is marked by something empty. An empty cross, and empty tomb and empty burial clothes. It is the very fact that each of these is empty that assures us that God's promises are real. Because they couldn't hold Jesus, because he couldn't be contained by the cross, the tomb, or even his burial clothes, we can be sure of the fullness of God's promises in our lives. During this Easter season, let us reaffirm our commitments to God and be grateful for the "Empty" tomb and the glorious promise of "Fullness," because of His Grace! Always Remember This... "HE IS RISEN!" Happy Easter to
