

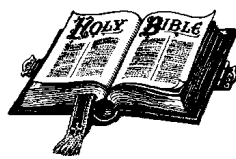


From the Pastor's Desk

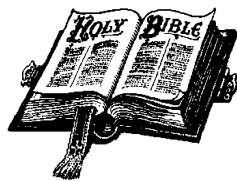

Food For Thought: Potatoes, Eggs, and Coffee Beans

Once upon a time a daughter complained to her father that her life was miserable and that she didn't know how she was going to make it. She was tired of fighting and struggling all the time. It seemed just as one problem was solved, another one soon followed.

From the Administrative Team

Second, coming up in 2022 is the 100 year anniversary of Baptist Tabernacle Church. We should soon be in planning for any celebrations and related activities to commemorate this momentous occasion! There are not many churches that can celebrate 100 years of service to God, its members and the community. The Administrative Team will also bring this to the attention of the Leadership Team at the July meeting to determine what we, as a Church, need to do as far as establishing a 100 year anniversary team to plan the activities and recommend those plans to the Leadership Team for the Church's approval. Again, be thinking and praying about this, as we will need volunteers to work on this project.

Third, the Leadership Team should recommend the Ministry Team leaders for the upcoming year to the Church for approval at the July Church Conference. This is done so the Ministry Team Members can be selected and recommended to the Church as a special called Church Conference in August in preparation of the new Ministry Teams taking office in September. Again, be thinking about these and praying for the Ministry Team Leaders and Members. If you are interested in working on any of the Ministry Teams, let the current or new Team Leaders know of your interest. We are always looking and needing new members for the Ministry Teams as the Church moves forward.

These are several items that we have to look forward to in the near future. There is never a lack of activities for the Church and there are always opportunities for Church Members to be involved in the activities of the Church. Harrison Hughes— Son of Holly and David Hughes.

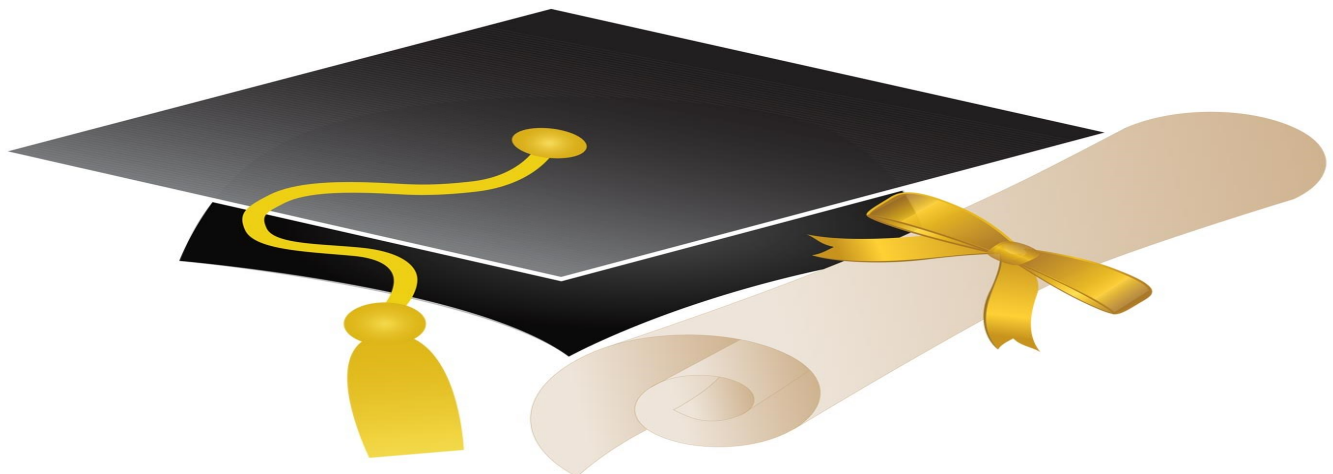

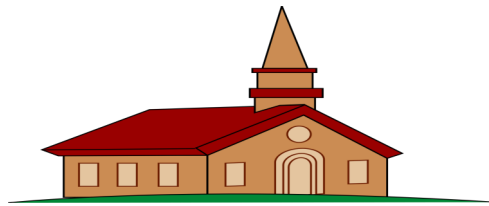
