We were greeted by Cheryl's Mom and Dad, given a simple set of instructions and then told to "have a good time." Yeah, sure! My friend Kenny, who never met a stranger, quickly became the life of the party. The music was loud and the food was amazing and I was a mess. From the Administrative Team

This month we continue with explanation of the responsibilities of the Administrative Team by reviewing The Administrative Team's responsibility to recommend the salaries of the Church Staff. This includes the Pastor, the Youth Director, and the Church Secretary. Once the salaries are decided, the proposed salaries are included in the annual Church Budget which is submitted for Church approval during the December Church Conference.

Pastor Salary – The Administrative Team works with the Deacons to establish the Pastor's salary, since they are responsible to perform the annual evaluation of the Pastor. The Administrative Team also researches salaries of other pastors within North Carolina, using the size of the Church, annual budget of the Churches, and average attendance. Lifeway compiles this data from churches all over the state and prepares a report. This report is available to churches that input their data into their database. By searching that information, we can determine if our Pastor's salary is comparable to churches similar to us. Then, with the recommendation of the Deacons and comparison to other churches, we determine the proposed salary that we recommend for our Pastor. This recommendation is in the annual budget proposal.

<u>Youth Director</u> – The Administrative Team determines the Youth Director's salary in a similar manner as with the Pastor. They

work with the Pastor and the Deacons to establish the proposed salary of the Youth Director. Additionally, the same Lifeway database is utilized to evaluate the salary based on other Youth Directors throughout North Carolina. Again, by doing this, we can make sure that our salaries are comparable to those within the state.

Church Secretary – The Administrative Team also uses the Lifeway database to evaluate other church's secretary salaries and consults with both the Pastor and the Deacon's to derive the proposed salary. It is usually based on a recommended increase from the Deacons and the Pastor and then compared with other church secretaries throughout the state.

Again, by comparing our staff salaries with others within our state, we can make sure that we are competitive with other churches as well as maintaining the salaries within an acceptable level.

We hope this continued effort to explain the duties of the Administrative Team helps you understand better what the Administrative Team does for the Church. And as always, if you have any questions, comments, or recommendations for the Administrative Team, please feel free to contact any member concerning any of these items. Next month we will detail the Administrative Team's role in compiling other Ministry Teams' budget requests into the annual Church Budget.

Bible Character-James, the Elder

James, also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater was born in Galilee. He was one of the Twelve Apostles, distinguished as being in Jesus' innermost circle and the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament (Acts 12:2). James and his younger brother, the apostle John, are designated "sons of thunder" (Mark 3:17), perhaps because of their characteristic fiery zeal (Mark 9:38, Luke 9:54). With Peter and Andrew, James and John were the first four disciples whom Jesus called (Mark 1:16–19) and whose question ("Tell us, when will this [the end of time] be, and what will be the sign when these things are all to be accomplished?") sparks Jesus' eschatological discourse in Mark 13. As a member of the inner circle, James witnessed the raising of Jairus' daughter (Mark 5:37, Luke 8:51), the Transfiguration (Mark 9:2), and Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane (Mark 14:33, Matthew 26:37). James and John asked Jesus to let them sit, one at his right and one at his left, in his future glory

(Mark 10:35–40), a favour that Jesus said was not His to grant. James was beheaded by order of King Herod Agrippa I of Judaea; according to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, where his shrine attracts pilgrims from all over the world, even today.
